


A moment in history

The Navy Department, awakened to the possibilities of aviation, began prevailing upon Congress to include a provision for aeronautical development in the Naval Appropriation Act enacted in 1911–12. In October 1913, Secretary of the Navy Josephus Daniels appointed a board to make a survey of aeronautical needs and to

establish a policy to guide future development. One of the board's most important recommendations was the establishment of an aviation training station in Pensacola.

Upon entry into World War I, Pensacola, still the only naval air station, had 38 naval aviators, 163 enlisted men trained in aviation, and 54 airplanes. Two years later, by the signing of the armistice in November 1918, the air station, with 438 officers and 5538 enlisted men, had trained 1,000 naval aviators. At war's end, seaplanes, dirigibles, and free kite balloons were housed in steel and wooden hangars stretching a mile down the air station beach.


July 4th usually mean fireworks. But handling them can be hazardous. The National Safety Council gives us this advice.

Fireworks Safety Tips: If You Choose to Use Legal Fireworks

If consumer fireworks are legal to buy where you live and you choose to use them, be sure to follow the following safety tips:

- * Never allow young children to handle fireworks
- * Older children should use them only under close adult supervision
- * Never use fireworks while impaired by drugs or alco-
- * Anyone using fireworks or standing nearby should wear protective eyewear
- * Never hold lighted fireworks in your hands
- * Never light them indoors

- * Only use them away from people, houses and flammable material
- * Never point or throw fireworks at another person
- * Only light one device at a time and maintain a safe distance after lighting
- * Never ignite devices in a container
- * Do not try to re-light or handle malfunctioning fireworks
- * Soak both spent and unused fireworks in water for a few hours before discarding
- * Keep a bucket of water nearby to fully extinguish fireworks that don't go off or in case of fire
- * Never use illegal fireworks
